ACI EUROPE (Airports Council International Europe) is the voice of Europe's airports. We are a non-profit organisation, whose prime purpose is to represent and lead the European airport industry as well as to promote professional excellence in airport management and operations. We are also the European region of Airports Council International, the only worldwide professional association of airport operators.

ACI EUROPE is the European region of Airports Council International (ACI), the only worldwide professional association of airport operators. ACI EUROPE represents over 500 airports in 55 European countries. Air transport supports 13.5 million jobs, generating €886 billion in European economic activity (4.4% of GDP). In response to the Climate Emergency, in June 2019 our members committed to achieving Net Zero carbon emissions for operations under their control by 2050, without offsetting.

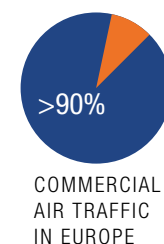

OUR STRUCTURE

Each region of ACI has its own Board, budget and work programme. ACI EUROPE is governed by the Board of Directors composed of the Chief Executive Officers (CEOs) of 24 member airports and is chaired by a President who is elected annually by the General Assembly of ACI EUROPE.

Our organisation is based in Brussels, Belgium and has a team of 27 people, under the leadership of Director General Olivier Jankovec.

Policy input comes from 6 committees, 4 fora and several working groups, made up of experts from member airports and World Business Partners. These also allow us to stay continuously informed of the real life challenges facing the airport industry.

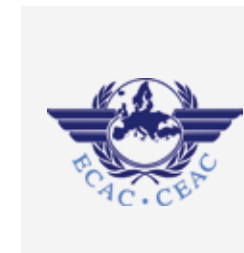

In 2009, we launched *Airport Carbon Accreditation*, the only institutionally-endorsed, carbon management certification standard for airports. The programme independently assesses and recognises the efforts of airports to manage and reduce their carbon emissions with four levels of certification: 'Mapping', 'Reduction', 'Optimisation' & 'Neutrality'.

PROGRESS... THROUGH COOPERATION & COLLABORATION

We actively work on a day-to-day basis with the institutions of the European Union, as well as the European Civil Aviation Conference (ECAC), the European Organisation for the Safety of Air Navigation (EUROCONTROL), the European Union Aviation Safety Agency (EASA), the SESAR Joint Undertaking and all the national civil aviation authorities in Europe. Colleagues in ACI World pursue the same mission with the International Civil Aviation Organization of the United Nations (ICAO) and other world organisations.



We maintain close relationships with many national airport operator associations and with a number of organisations, with interests related to the aviation industry.

These include the Air Transport Action Group (ATAG), the International Air Transport Association (IATA), the European Regions Airline Association (ERA), Airlines International Representation in Europe (AIRE), the Civil Air Navigation Services Organisation (CANSO), Airport Regions Conference (ARC), European Disability Forum (EDF), the European Travel Retail Council (ETRC), the Assembly of European Regions (AER) and the General Directorate of State Airports Authority (DHMI).

We as ACI EUROPE, maintain regular dialogue on international issues with other regions of Airports Council International (ACI AFRICA, ACI ASIA-PACIFIC, ACI LATIN AMERICA-CARIBBEAN and ACI NORTH AMERICA) and our global coordination office, ACI WORLD.
